This, then, is how you should pray:
Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.
Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread,
and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

*Matthew 6:9-13* 

Remember the discussion in my last letter; Jesus sat down waiting for those who would gather for his instruction. We talked about our invitation to allow Jesus to be teacher and us students. It is both a humble and expectant position. Here we have our teacher, instructing us in, perhaps, the most important way we are to interact with our God; how to pray.

Jesus' teaching on prayer begins before our text quoted above. In the section leading up to our text, Jesus contrasts wrong motivations and harmful ways to conceptualize prayer. What I think would be helpful to summarize for our purpose is the motivation of our prayer. Our deepest longing in prayer needs to not be confused by others seeing us pray. It is not wrong to pray with others, but it is essential that we are praying to an audience of one. Prayer is purely between you and your loving Father: protect the heart of it.

The first thing I want to point out is that Jesus gave us a prayer to pray. It wasn't simply a model, it itself is something to be said. As we recite this prayer again and again it will begin to shape how we think about God and this world. Not only are we being reshaped to know God as a personal loving Father, we too are being reshaped in how we view this world and what we are to long for.

Now looking at our quoted scripture above Jesus begins with - you call him "Father." This by itself is enough to sit with for quite some time. The God who created all things and rules them by the word of his mouth, wants to be known to us as personally as a loving Father.

Not only that, notice it says "our." Those who are following Jesus are to see those doing the same as family, having the same Father. We are then invited to long for all of our Father's love, power, and desires to be held in the highest of honor among all his creation. That longing posture turns us to the next line. If God's name were to be honored, his kingdom realized among us, how would our world differ? If God's ways of justice, forgiveness, peace, and love for God and

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neighbor were fully known - What sins against each other would we be turning from, what acts of kindness and mercy would we be pursuing, what appreciation and care would we have for all his provision in creation. These are the longings Jesus wants to instill in us every time we pray.

In multiple ways, we are invited to remember our right posture before God in this prayer. We are subjects, he is the King. We are the recipient, he is the giver. We are the offender, he is the pardoner. We are needy, he is the rescuer. All of these things speak to me of the way life ought to have been in the garden with Adam and Eve. We know our rightful place and we know God's rightful place. When those two things are right everything else falls into a peaceful state.

As I write the words, "We are the recipient, he is the giver." I cannot help but think of the people we are privileged to serve. In our pantry, we have a section of the above prayer hanging up by our produce tables. It reads, "Our Father in heaven ... give us this day our daily bread." It is my prayer that the right people, at the right moment, look up at that scripture and give thanks to their Father who is doing just that for them.
